

«How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Online School»

Online lecture 13:30 - 15:30

A global pandemic struck and nobody saw it coming; except of course that big number of experts and scientists that nobody was listening to. The big irony is that we have been overwhelmed, and we were underprepared.

Teaching processes and the educational system changed more radically last year than in the decades before. After the first shock and disbelief, we find ourselves in limbo between “no biggy” and “what a catastrophe”! School has since become different: the educational system which is by itself rigid and inert, complex and resistant to change, flipped over in a matter of weeks. Now our students are not in our classrooms, but on our screens. We’re all «zoomed» out, and while some more than others: we have all changed.

The Sars-Cov-2 changed a lot of things in education, but it seems like teachers around the world are trying hard to copy the old approaches into a “new normal”.

This lecture is my short story about «How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Online School». As teachers we continue to face challenges, and we improvise solutions. In this workshop I share with you what I have learned, hoping to form a dialogue to discuss best practices.
